














GEORGE TOWN


Welcome to the George Town UNESCO World Heritage Site. Situated on the northeast quarter of the Penang island, George Town is the capital of Penang and perhaps the second busiest city in Malaysia after Kuala Lumpur. Every year, thousands of people who visit Penang start their journey here. Whether you touch down at sunrise or step down from your cruise-liner in the evening, the experience will be just as unique.

For centuries, George Town has been the port of call for ships from all over the world. Today, the sense that overwhelms every traveller here is no different from when the founder Captain Francis Light and his first settlers made land here in 1786 - the desire to explore, discover and indulge.





Traditional festivals include Pongal, Chinese New Year and Thaipusam in the first quarter of the year, then there is the Vaisakhi Celebration, Wesak Day, Ramadan, Hari Raya Aidilfitri, Hungry Ghost Festival, Nine Emperor Gods' Festival, Deepavali, Dragon Boat Festival and the list goes on.

Modern festivals line up the calendar year with arts and culture events such as the George Town Festival, George Town Literary Festival, as well as other annual events - the Penang International Food Festival, Penang Hot Air Balloon Fiesta and Penang Anime
